Call to Order

The mayor and aldermen met on Monday, April 22, 2014 at the Clarksburg City Hall. Mayor Reed called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The minutes from the March 17 meeting were read by Terry. Alderman Smith made a motion to accept the minutes as read. Motion seconded by Alderman Scates. Motion passed unanimously.

Old Business

1. Tina Milam did not appear representing the benevolent committee therefore that issue has been tabled.
2. Mayor Reed inquired about the seized car we have in possession. Terry reported the State of Tennessee has awarded us the car noting that the defendant has until April 29, 2014 to file a second appeal.
3. Mayor Reed reported that Barker Tree Service trimmed the tree in the parking lot at city hall. Alderman Smith made a motion to have them trim the tree branches overhanging the walking track. Alderman Scates seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
4. Alderman Smith made a motion for the town to repair Conda Slaton's driveway and to replace a culvert at Anna Buttrey's residence. They were damaged during Phase 3 of the sewer project (both located on Haley Street). Mayor Reed is to contact Road Commissioner Ricky Scott. Motion seconded by Alderman Scates. Motion passed unanimously.
5. Discussion was heard about the Christmas lights. Mayor Reed is to contact Darrell Shands, Scotty Bell and the Wise men (Mennonites) about welding some Christmas light frames. It was discussed that Dale Bartholomew has not completed the wiring for the Christmas lights as was reported at the March meeting. Alderman Smith will contact Danny Simpson about the work.
6. Mayor Reed reported that it is not feasible to put the seized cars on the city's property across from the Clarksburg Supermarket. He has talked to Sherriff Dickson and to County Mayor McBride. Both said we could use the county's lot at no charge however;

they would not be responsible for any damages or theft of the vehicles. The board is planning to look at another area near the entrance to the city park. This will be discussed at the May board meeting.

New Business

1. We have had one zoning application completed by Larry Bolen. He has moved a mobile home to 157 Chumney Lane. Mayor Reed approved the application.
2. Discussion was heard about increasing the court costs and the fee for driving school. Alderman Scates made a motion to increase the court costs to \$120 effective July 1, 2014. Motion seconded by Alderman Smith. Alderman Scates made a motion to increase the cost of driving school to \$130 effective July 1, 2014. Motion seconded by Alderman Smith. Both motions passed unanimously.
3. Mayor Reed presented a resolution from the Carroll County Health Council asking that we resolve to create and promote a local walking club to participate as a member of "Carroll County Walk". Alderman Scates made a motion to approve the resolution. Alderman Smith seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously. All present declined to be the team leader.
4. Discussion was heard about purchasing a new police car (or SUV). Mayor Reed will obtain estimates for the May meeting.
5. Alderman Smith made a motion to accept the financial report. Motion seconded by Alderman Scates. Motion passed unanimously.
6. Alderman Smith made a motion to adjourn at 6:55 p.m. Motion seconded by Alderman Scates. Motion passed unanimously.
