Call to Order

The mayor and aldermen met on Monday, July 21, 2014 at the Clarksburg City Hall. Mayor Reed called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The minutes from the June 16 meeting were read by Terry. Alderman Smith made a motion to accept the minutes as read. Motion seconded by Alderman Scates. Motion passed unanimously.

Old Business

1. Mayor Reed reported that he had contacted two people about the Christmas lights and they were not interested in the work. It was suggested he contact Gordon Wildridge and the Carroll County Vocational Technical School for the work.
2. Mayor Reed stated some of the work had been done at the Buttrey and Slaton residences on Haley Street.
3. Alderman Scates made a motion to delay voting on helping the park board with the cost until the August meeting. They do not have all of the bids. Alderman Smith seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
4. Mayor Reed reported that the Town of Huntingdon will repair the leak at Patsy Haywood's residence and then repair the hole caused from the sewer system.

5. Terry reported that Mr. Todd could not be here due to training for those helping with the upcoming elections. He will present the information on the proposed website at the August meeting.

### New Business

1. Mayor Reed presented a zoning application from Billy and Diane Altom. They are planning to have a mobile home (manufactured) moved to their property. The application included a photo and floor plan of the home along with locations of a garage/storage shed and porch. Mayor Reed approved the application.
2. Discussion was heard about the 2003, 2005 and 2014 police cars. Mayor Reed reported that he had the lights and striping taken off of the 2005 vehicle. He said he instructed Officer Verner to use the 2003 car as the canine vehicle. Alderman Smith made a motion to have B & E Electronics install the lights, radios, radar, etc. on the new car when it arrives. Motion seconded by Alderman Scates. Motion passed unanimously.
3. Mayor Reed stated that Officer Cole had ordered and received most of the lights, striping, etc. for the new 2014 car. He had to order the items before June 30, 2014 in accordance with the Tennessee Governor's Highway Safety Program. Officer Cole has begun the paperwork for the next grant.
4. Mayor Reed reported that there was a water leak on Hampton Lane. Years ago when the Clarksburg Utility District constructed the water system the water lines on Hampton Lane were put under the road. Later, when the Town of Clarksburg paved the town streets they paved over the water lines (not knowing that is where they were located). The leak is under the road. It has been recommended to install a new water line beside the road instead of digging up the road, repairing the existing line and repaving the road. Frances Hampton respectfully requested that the town pay for a portion of the cost, estimated at \$1000. Alderman Scates made a motion that the town pays half of the cost to relocate the water line outside of the street. Motion seconded by Alderman Smith. Motion passed unanimously.
5. Discussion was heard about the town's upcoming payment of a bank note at Carroll Bank and Trust. Mayor Reed suggested paying half of the balance and interest and paying the balance in August 2015. Alderman Smith made a motion to pay this amount from the general fund. Motion seconded by Alderman Scates. Motion passed unanimously.

6. Alderman Scates made a motion to accept the financial reports for June 2014. Alderman Smith seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
7. Alderman Smith made a motion to adjourn at 6:35 p.m. Motion seconded by Alderman Scates. Motion passed unanimously.
