Call to Order

The Mayor and Aldermen met on August 21, 2017 at Clarksburg City Hall. Mayor Peterson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Prayer by Jimmy McClure. The minutes were read by Leigh Grice. Alderman Etter made a motion to accept, seconded by Alderman McClure. Motion passed.

Old Business

1. The new playground equipment for the park has been ordered, Nate McDonald with Game Time will let us know in a couple of weeks the estimated time of arrival and install.
2. Mayor Peterson gave an update on the Phase V Sewer Expansion project. Hopefully the project will be finished this week and go live next week.

New Business

1. The City of Clarksburg was awarded financial assistance as provided under the Tennessee Dept. of Transportation -2015 Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Project. Alderman McClure made a motion to adopt a Resolution for Engineering Services, for TLM Associates, Inc. to provide assistance in the implementation of the City's 2015 SRTS Project. Seconded by Alderman Etter. Motion passed.
2. In February 2017, the City of Clarksburg Police Department seized a 2005 Mercury Sable. As of June 30, 2017, the city received a Final Order of Forfeiture from the State of TN. Alderman Etter made a motion to sell the vehicle, seconded by Alderman McClure. Motion passed.
3. In April of 2017 Mr. Teddy Bartholomew, was given a copy of Ordinance No. 09-19-07, **AN ORDINANCE REQUIREING THE PAYMENT OF A MINIMUM SEWER BILL AND CONNECTION FEE** that was previously passed on September 19, 2007. In this Ordinance it states Whereas, the City of Clarksburg is required by the State of TN as a condition of the funding through the State of TN Dept. of Economic and Community Development Community Development Block Grant and State Revolving Fund for the Construction of the sewer project to require all residences, businesses, or industries who have

public sanitary sewer available to hook on to the sewer system or pay a minimum bill. Mr. Bartholomew would like to formally request to see where in the contract with the State of Tennessee this is written. Mayor Peterson asked Mr. Michael King to research this.

4. The Financial Report for July was reviewed. Alderman McClure made a motion to accept, seconded by Alderman Etter. Motion passed.
5. Alderman Etter made a motion to adjourn at 6:15 p.m., seconded by Alderman McClure. Motion passed.
