Call to Order

The mayor and aldermen met on Monday, August 17, 2015, at the Clarksburg City Hall. Mayor Peterson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The minutes were read by City Attorney Michael King. Alderman McClure made a motion to accept the minutes as read. Motion seconded by Mayor Peterson. Motion passed unanimously.

Old Business

1. Alderman McClure reported that the cost of the flags would be approximately \$200 for the city and \$200 for the Ruritan Club. This would be for 30 flags. They are made in the U.S.A. Motion was made by Alderman McClure and seconded by Mayor Peterson. Motion passed unanimously.
2. Mayor Peterson reported that the application process was going good for the City Recorder position. He explained that since Pam Hunley has agreed to help out until we feel we have the right person for the job, we don't feel the need to rush and hire.

New Business

1. Mayor Peterson read a letter from Habitat for Humanity for a benefit gold event hosted by Habitat. They were asking for a donation. The board decided against this.
2. Mayor Peterson showed a letter from a concerned citizen asking the city to help pay the bills for another citizen in the community. The board voted not to do this.
3. Mayor Peterson gave a public thank-you to the fire department for burning the pile for the city.
4. Mayor Peterson reported that the letters sent out by City Attorney Michael King for delinquent sewer bills had produced some good results.

5. Mayor reported on the one customer who had a large sewer bill. The customer has agreed to pay the amount of the actual bill without the late fee and penalty. Motion made by Alderman McClure and seconded by Mayor Peterson, to pass judgment stating that if the customer pays the monthly charge in addition to the amount of the previous bill, the account will be up-to-date.
6. Mayor Peterson reported we had one zoning request. He had went and looked at the proposed building.
7. Mayor Peterson reported that he went to the sale of the Hyatt property today but the property did not sell.
8. Mayor Peterson reported that the city paid off the balance at Carroll Bank and Trust for street paving.
9. Alderman McClure made a motion to accept the financial report. Motion was seconded by Mayor Peterson.
10. Alderman McClure made a motion to adjourn at 6:20 p.m. Mayor Peterson seconded the motion.
